Rigs must be prepared to boondock. However, we do have exclusive use of a large building with bathrooms (no showers). Rigs may arrive any time after 10 a.m. on Friday and leave as late as 9 a.m. Monday morning. It is not necessary to be a member when attending one's first rally, so encourage your camping friends to give the Chapter a try.

NYSKPS CHAPTER 41 MINUTES: June 6, 2009

The June 6, 2009 meeting of NYSKPS Chapter 41 was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Vice President Bill Nixon in the absence of President Bruce Robinson. After the Pledge to the Flag, V.P. Bill called the roll of Officers: V.P. Bill Nixon, Secretary Carol Berggren, Treasurer Bev Quinn and Officer at Large Elizabeth Bell were present. New members, Eric and Ginny La Juene were introduced and given their Chapter patches. Guests, Bill and Mary Robertson were recognized as well as our VCR's, Roger and Liz Grant from the state of Washington. Also present at the meeting were members: Dick Quinn, the Merpaws, Doris Marks, Esther Tallamy, Jeanne Nixon, the Straights, Bill Mikiewicz, Barbara Walling, the Lyngards, Grace Whitbeck, the Krumenackers, John Berggren, the Van Deusens, and the LaJuenes.

Secretary Carol Berggren read the minutes of the September 2008 meeting. There being no corrections, Fred Lyngard moved to accept the minutes as read, seconded by Dick Quinn, motioned carried.

Treasurer Bev Quinn reported that the balance on hand as of June 6, 2009 was \$1552.00 with further rally expenses to be reimbursed. Kath Krumenacker moved to accept the report, Grace Whitbeck seconded, motion carried.

Vice President Bill Nixon reported that there are three possibilities for the June and September 2010 rallies. Final information will be posted in the Newsletter, website and voice mail and Escapees Magazine as soon as decisions are made.

Newsletter Editor John Berggren reported that the Newsletter is sent twice yearly (after each rally) and often in late winter while he is on the road, with rally reminders, etc.. He encouraged members to send him word of their travels to share with others.

VCR Roger Grant explained the role of the VCR's and shared information from the Sedalia Escapade. There were 758 rigs, 1588 people and the latest SKP # was 106,469. The Escapees Club needs 30,000 ACTIVE members to remain viable. Also mentioned was the need to register early for any HOP as they are sometimes cancelled because of an apparent lack of interest due to people waiting too long to sign up.

Under OLD BUSINESS: V.P. Bill reported on his and Jeanne's stay at Rainbow Plantation in Alabama, highly recommending it to all. Officer at Large, Elizabeth Bell spoke about CARE and hoped Chapter 41 would be sending a donation. She also asked the VCR to explain the Senior Escapee dues rate and definition of same.

Under NEW BUSINESS: Julie VanDeusen had information and hand-outs for the July 17-19, 2009 Finger Lakes Wine Festival at Watkins Glen, NY and the September 25, 2009 Adirondack Balloon Festival in Glens Fall, NY, encouraging folks to try to meet if they were planning to attend either of these events. Barbara Walling suggested Chapter 41 consider extending rally dates to before and after the Friday-Sunday times. Although this is offered on the reservation sheet when available, the idea proposed was to have hosts on site for the extra days. The announcement was made that Robbie Greenblatt, widow of former Chapter 41 President Alex Greenblatt would be coming to visit Saturday afternoon. Sunshine Report noted that Jane and Burt Luther had been unable to attend this rally due to health concerns but were sending greetings to all and hoped to see everyone in September. Also, Rich and Kath Krumenacker WERE able to attend and were grateful for all the support they continue to receive with Rich's ongoing health challenges. Esther Tallamy spoke eloquently about the importance of getting actively involved in the Chapter and to consider doing so as "a privilege, not a job."

ELECTION OF OFFICERS: The Nominating Committee reviewed the slate of candidates : President: Bruce Robinson, Secretary: Carol Berggren, Treasurer: Bev Quinn, Officer at Large: Elizabeth Bell. Vice President asked if there were any other nominations from the floor. Jeanne Nixon nominated Christine Straight for President, Dick Quinn seconded. V.P. asked if anyone objected to using a show of hands for election voting. As there was no objection, V.P. called for a vote on the office of President. Christine Straight was elected. V.P. then asked if there were any other nominations from the floor for the other three offices. As there were none, Elizabeth Bell moved that the Secretary cast one ballot for the slate, Rich Krumenacker seconded, motioned carried.

John Berggren asked that the Secretary send a thank you to Bruce Robinson for his years of service to the Chapter as President. Unanimously approved.

Grace Whitbeck moved to adjourn the meeting, Fred Lyngard seconded, motion carried.

RECIPE CORNER

BAKED SPAGHETTI

1 Pound of Spaghetti ¼ Cup Chopped Onion
½ Pound Hamburg Prego Original spaghetti sauce
½ Pound Hot Italian Sausage

Crumble Hamburg and Sausage and fry with onions until well done. (Drain well)

Heat sauce, add Hamburg, Sausage and onions

Boil Spaghetti until tender with one teaspoon of vegetable oil in water. (Drain but do not rinse) (Oil prevents sticking)

Mix hot Spaghetti and hot meat sauce together in a baking pan and cool overnight or longer.

When ready to serve:

Cover with shredded cheese of choice

Bake at 300 degrees until heated thoroughly

Cut and serve (Approx 6 servings)

HASH BROWN BREAKFAST CASSEROLE

30 oz pkg frozen shredded potatoes 12 eggs, beaten

1 lb pre-cooked flavored sausage links, cut up 1 cup milk

½ onion, finely diced 1 tsp salt

1 green pepper, finely diced 1 tsp pepper

2 cups shredded cheese, Colby/jack herbs to compliment sausage flavor

Grease 6 quart crockpot with butter. Alternately layer the first five ingredients in several thin layers. Mix last five ingredients and pour over layers. Cook on low 6-8 hours. (high 3-4 hours) Done when eggs are fully cooked, edges start to brown. (Longer for cheese to brown and sides crispy.) Serve with catsup or salsa.

OUR CHAPTER BYLAWS AND STANDING RULES

A copy of our Chapter's Bylaws and Standing Rules are included below. While they are always posted at rallies, please save a printed copy of them for your use in the future. The basic format of the Bylaws is Escapees "boilerplate" while the underlined portions were inserted by our chapter with the approval of the the national Escapees RV Club in 1996. The Standing Rules were adopted by the chapter over the years as per Article X of the Bylaws.

BYLAWS FOR CHAPTER 41 OF ESCAPEES RV CLUB

Adopted 9/11/1996

ARTICLE I: NAME, LOCATION, AND RECORDS

Section 1. The name of the Chapter/C-BOF is Chapter 41 NYSKPS

Section 2. The general geographic area is loosely defined as New York State

Section 3. The chapter/c-BOF records shall be kept in triplicate, with one copy in the possession of the secretary, one in the possession of the president, and one copy sent to the national headquarters of Escapees RV Club.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

This chapter/c-BOF was organized on 5/22/1996 for the purpose of providing a framework for members of Escapees RV Club to make new friends through organized rallies and other announced social activities.

ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

Membership in this chapter/c-BOF is open to all current members of Escapees RV Club

ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS AND DUTIES

Section 1. The elected officers of this chapter/c-BOF shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and 1 officer(s)-at-large. The officers shall constitute the executive board.

Section 2. The term of office for each elected officer shall be 2 year(s); however, each officer shall serve until replaced. Terms will/will not be staggered. Officers may serve more than one term.

Section 3. In the event the chapter/c-BOF is unable to fill the position of vice president or officers-at-large, it shall not constitute a violation of these bylaws.

Section 4. Duties of officers are described in the *Chapter/c-BOF Officers Handbook* from national headquarters.

ARTICLE V: MEETINGS

Section 1. Conducting the business of this chapter/c-BOF shall be in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order when such rules are not in conflict with the bylaws or specific directives from Escapees RV Club.

Section 2. A quorum of 15% members, including one elected officer, shall be required for conducting the business of the chapter/c-BOF at meetings. A majority vote of members present is required.

Section 3. A meeting shall be held at each rally where a quorum is present. A minimum of one rally a year must be held. All members shall be notified in writing as to the date, place, and time of all meetings. Such notification requirement will be satisfied by any mailing at least 30 days prior to the event, including, but not limited to, the chapter/c-BOF newsletter and/or *Escapees* magazine.

Section 4. Executive board meetings shall be held at the call of the president, or at the request of any other two elected officers.

Section 5. Accurate minutes must be kept of business conducted at all meetings. Minutes will be the only legal record of all meetings. Votes at all meetings will be recorded, and at the board meetings votes are to be recorded by name.

ARTICLE VI: ELECTIONS

Section 1. The officers shall be elected at the meeting on (at) in the spring.

Section 2. Nominations: A nominating committee shall be appointed by the president at least 6 months prior to the month of the election. The nominating committee shall obtain at least one nominee for each office. Other members may mail in nominations for any office. All nominees must give written consent to be considered. Exception: Additional nominations, with verbal consent, may be taken from the floor of a regular meeting. All nominations for each office shall be published in the last chapter/c-BOF newsletter prior to the election meeting.

Section 3. Voting shall be by ballot. A majority of votes cast is required to elect each officer.

Section 4. The new officers will assume their respective offices on (at) the close of the meeting.

ARTICLE VII: DUES

The dues will be no more than \$10.00 annually, and will be due on October 1 of each year. Any member whose dues are not paid by January 1 shall be dropped from the chapter/c-BOF rolls. The amount of dues shall be set forth in the standing rules.

ARTICLE VIII: EMERGENCY ACTION

In the event that any required action cannot be completed as set forth in these bylaws, the executive board may take emergency action for the benefit of the chapter/c-BOF, which emergency action must be submitted to the membership for ratification by ballot.

ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS TO BYLAWS

These bylaws may be amended or revised only after written approval of Escapees RV Club. All members must be notified of proposed amendments and furnished with a ballot to be returned. Approval of two-thirds of the ballots received is required for an amendment to carry.

ARTICLE X: STANDING RULES

The chapter/c-BOF may adopt a set of standing rules to cover activities and/or situations not specified in the bylaws. These standing rules may not be in conflict with, or supersede, the bylaws. These standing rules may be adopted, amended, revised, or repealed at any publicized meeting upon approval of two-thirds of the members present.

ARTICLE XI: INDEMNIFICATION

Each officer and committee member, while serving as such, shall be indemnified against any and all claims and liabilities to which he or she may be subjected because of service, or by reason of any act or omission alleged to have been committed by such officer or committee member, unless such act is the result of a willful or grossly negligent act or omission on the part of said officer or committee member.

ARTICLE XII: FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

Any officer, rally host, committee member, member, or guest who is handling any type of funds for the chapter/c-BOF shall keep an accurate account of such funds, including receipts and disbursements, and shall turn over said funds, with a written balance accounting, to the treasurer in an expeditious manner.

ARTICLE XIII: DISSOLUTION

In the event of the dissolution of this chapter/c-BOF, all obligations shall be paid and any remaining assets shall be sent to Escapees RV Club. Escapees RV Club shall not be liable for any debts incurred by the chapter/c-BOF.

ARTICLE XIV: RELEASE OF OFFICER

Any officer may be removed, with or without cause, by a majority vote of all of the Board (which consists of officers and official appointments, e.g. editor, historian, etc.) and/or with the approval from Escapees Chapter Directors, or he/she may resign at any time. (added by National 4/25/05)

 4. Currently dues are set at \$5.00 annually. (9/96)
 5. Editor shall receive an advance of \$150.00 to cover expenses of printing and mailing the newsletter. (9/96)
 6. Officers shall receive an advance of \$25.00 to cover expenses incurred by them on behalf of the Chapter. (9/97)
 7. Join National Escapee Club at Chapter #41 Rally and receive a years membership in NYSKPS Chapter. (9/97)
 8. Chapter Row Rep shall be reimbursed for Electricity. (9/98)
 9. The number of Chapter members shall be determined by the number of individuals named on the roster, and also, the number of individuals in attendance at a meeting to determine a quorum. (9/99)
 10. Members of NYSKPS attending their first rally shall receive a Chapter Patch. (6/05)
 11. No animals will be allowed at meetings or meals during a rally. (8/06)
