SEPTEMBER RALLY REPORT

Lakeside Farm and Cider Mill

Ballston Lake, NY

September 11-13, 2009

Surrounded by fields of wild flowers, the apple barn filled with baskets of shiny fruit and the aroma of cider doughnuts wafting from the antique doughnut maker, seventeen rigs and thirty-four Escapees gathered on Friday at Lakeside Farm and Cider Mill for an outstanding Rally. Registration ran smoothly as hosts Carol Berggren and Julie VanDeusen greeted everyone and passed out name tags, welcome bags, Friendship Quilt tickets, door prize tickets and sold 50/50 tickets. Each rig's one-pound secret bag for the CARE Auction was weighed and placed on the Auction table. Host John Berggren and assistant Bill Mikewicz braved the downpours and directed rigs to their parking areas. Later, as rain pelted the metal roof of the large building, folks enjoyed a Friendship Hour, meeting old and new friends. The indoor campfire (provided by Bruce and Lori Robinson) was perfect for gathering round and singing to the music provided by John Berggren on guitar and Fred Lyngard on keyboard, after a moment of silence to remember the victims of 9/11 and all those who have perished since.

Saturday morning the piles of freshly-made cider doughnuts and pastries, huge bowl of fresh-cut fruit, juices, tea and coffee got everyone ready for the day ahead. Bill Mikewicz auctioning off the Friendship Quilt he'd won Sunday morning, (proceeds to go to CARE)to John Straight and then donating \$20. of his 50/50 Winnings (yes, he also won that!!] the GRAND TOTAL raised for CARE was \$270.00!!!! An eclectic collection of containers with zinnias and sunflowers among the apple-printed placemats created an inviting setting for dinner. The Farm put on a Chicken Barbecue that would satisfy the most discerning diner! Half a chicken, baked potato, coleslaw, rolls, just-picked SWEET corn, pumpkin, apple and cherry pies (with whipped cream if desired), apple cider, iced tea, lemonade and hot coffee and tea made for an incredibly delicious meal! An outdoor campfire (wood provided) rounded out a perfect day for all.

Bright sunshine greeted us Sunday morning. Again, the Farm provided us with a wonderful breakfast. Dick Pearce, owner of Lakeside, was introduced and given a huge round of applause for the terrific rally site and all the food and drinks provided for the weekend. Prizes were awarded with each rig receiving a door prize of their choice from the table of items donated by members and merchants. NYSKPS CHAPTER 41 MINUTES: SEPTEMBER 12, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 8:50 am by President Christine Straight. After the Pledge of Allegiance led by Allan Webster, the Roll Call of Officers found President Christine Straight, Vice President Bill Nixon, Secretary Carol Berggren, Treasurer Bev Quinn and Officer At Large Elizabeth Bell all present. Also at the meeting were Chapter members: John Berggren, Rich and Kath Krumenacker, Eric and Ginny LaJuene, Fred and Phyllis Lyngard, Bill Mikiewicz, Jeanne Nixon, Dick Quinn, Bruce and Lori Robinson, Burt and Marion Robinson, John Straight, Bob and Joyce Stephenson, Esther Tallamy, Julie VanDeusen and Pat and Sue Vitek. Escapees full-timers at the meeting were introduced: Tom and Paula Nankivell/South Dakota, Larry and Joyce Space/ VT, Allan and Jeanne Webster/TX. (Gordon and Judy Kemp/TX were not at meeting). Chapter 41 members, Bob and Joyce Stephenson, were presented with Chapter patches as this was their first NYSKPS rally.

As there were no additions or corrections to the minutes as posted by the Secretary, the minutes were accepted as reported.

The Treasurer's Report showed a balance on hand of \$3097.00. Expenses for the Rally had not yet been deducted. Lori Robinson made a motion to accept the report as read, seconded by Ginny LaJuene. Motion carried. Treasurer also reported on thank you from CARE for the June donation of \$50. which brought the Chapter total contributions to \$563.00.

Rally Hosts John and Carol Berggren and Julie VanDeusen were introduced and thanked. Seventeen rigs and thirty-four folks attended the rally.

President Christine introduced the following appointments: John Berggren/Newsletter Editor and Membership Chair, Eric LaJuene/Webmaster, Fred Lyngard/Voicemail, Marg Merpaw/Sunshine, and Bill Mikiewicz/Assistant to Historian. The Treasurer was directed to keep an inventory of all items belonging to the Chapter. The Officer at Large was directed to collect a 25 cent fine for anyone not wearing a nametag during the rally.

Wagonmaster Bill Nixon reported on the Rally sites for 2010. June 11-13, Byron, NY and Sept. 10-12, Glenville, NY. Details were posted at this rally and will be noted in Newsletter, Website and Voice Mail. Bill also reported on a Chapter 20 Rally in Troy, PA that the Nixons and Straights attended as well as Stephensons who have a seasonal site there.

President Christine brought up a number of items under New Business;

Chapter Directors Denny and Susie Orr requested that we not schedule rallies on the same dates as an Escapade. There was much discussion basically pointing out the difficulty in New York State of getting RV Parks to hold an adequate number of sites up until two weeks before a rally without charging for the sites, used or not, unless the dates are before schools close and after schools open. This leaves the Chapter with non-conflicting September dates of Labor Day Weekend (never available) or the last weekend in September when many parks are closing and weather is getting pretty chilly. Also, it was felt

that Chapter members would not feel obligated to attend a Chapter rally if they wanted to attend an Escapade. The Spaces reminded the Chapter members that Escapades are now at different times/different years and the dates may not be a big issue. A motion was made by Lori Robinson and seconded by Bill Nixon that "Chapter 41 will make every effort to avoid a conflict with Escapade dates." Motion carried. Bill also noted that next September's Rally had already been booked and many plans made. That will not be changed.

The second item from Chapter Directors was the fact that our Election of Officers is not staggered as required in our By-Laws due to the lack of certain officers in the past. President Christine felt that an easy solution would be to have the Treasurer run for re-election in June (having completed one year of her two-year term) which would have the Vice-President and Treasurer's offices up for election in June 2010 with the President, Secretary and Officer At Large coming up in June 2011. Current Treasurer Bev Quinn agreed to the idea, stating that she would be willing to run for another two-year term in 2010. John Straight made a motion to have the offices of Vice President and Treasurer up for election in June 2010, second by Bill Nixon. Motion carried.

President Christine proposed updating Chapter 41 Standing Rules. After the reading of each of the 11 Standing Rules, by a show of hands, a majority voted to RETAIN the following six:

1. Deadline for the Newsletter is the 15th of the following month after a rally or Escapade. (9/96)
2. Dues are due October 1, if joining at a Spring Rally or later, dues are paid to October of the following year. (9/96)
3. Nametags to be worn at all Rallies. (9/96)
4. Currently dues are set at \$5.00 annually. (9/96)
7. Join National Escapees Club at a Chapter #41 Rally and receive a year's membership in NYSKPS Chapter 41. (9/97)
10. Members of NYSKPS Chapter 41 attending their first Chapter rally shall receive a Chapter patch. (6/05)
11. No animals will be allowed at meetings or meals during a rally. (8/06) [note: This Standing Rule will be sent to a committee for further discussion.]

The following Standing Rules were REMOVED with a motion, second, discussion and majority vote.

5. Editor shall receive an advance of \$150.00 to cover expenses of printing and mailing the newsletter. (9/96) Motion by Bell, second by C. Berggren
6. Officers shall receive an advance of \$25.00 to cover expenses incurred by them on behalf of the Chapter. (9/97) Motion by Bell, second by J. Berggren
8. Chapter Row rep shall be reimbursed for electricity. (9/98) Motion by Bell, second by L. Robinson
9. The number of Chapter members shall be determined by the number of individuals named on the roster, and also, the number of individuals in attendance at a meeting to determine a quorum. (9/99) Motion by Bell, second by J. Berggren

The following CHANGES were made to the above Standing Rules with a motion, second, discussion and majority vote.

- 5 and 6 combined to read: Officers may spend up to \$50.00 without pre-approval of the Executive Board and submit receipt for reimbursement. Motion by L. Robinson, second by C. Berggren
- 8 Chapter Row representative will be reimbursed up to \$200.00 for Escapade registration. Motion by J. VanDeusen, second by L. Robinson

The following Standing Rule was ADDED by motion, second, discussion and vote.

The immediate Past President of Chapter 41 will serve as an appointed Officer at Large. Motion C. Berggren, second Ginny LaJuene

Motion made by John Straight to adjourn, seconded by John Berggren. Motion carried.

RECIPE CORNER

CHOCOLATE REVEL BARS

1 c. butter	2 ½ c. flour
2 c. brown sugar (light)	1 tsp. baking soda
2 eggs	1 tsp. salt
2 tsp. vanilla	3 c. quick oats

Filling:

1 (12 oz.) bag semi-sweet choc. chips	2 tsp. vanilla
1 can sweetened condensed milk	1 c. chopped nuts
1 T. butter	½ tsp. salt

·Cream together butter and sugar, mix in eggs and vanilla. Sift together flour, baking soda and salt. Stir in oats and add to creamed mixture; set aside while making filling.

·Melt chocolate chips, sweetened condensed milk, butter and salt; stir until mixture is smooth and stir in nuts and vanilla.

·Spread about 2/3 of the oatmeal mixture in the bottom of a greased 10 X 15 ½ X 1 inch jellyroll pan, cover with chocolate mixture. Dot with remainder of oatmeal mixture and swirl it over chocolate. Bake in a 350° oven for 25 to 30 minutes, or until lightly browned. Yield: 60 (1 X 2 inch) bars. (Yes, vanilla in dough and filling.)

EASY COCKTAIL FRANKS

jar chili sauce 1 10oz. jar grape jelly 2 ½ T lemon juice 1 - 2 lbs. cocktail franks

Combine first 3 ingredients and cook, stirring, until smooth and starting to bubble.

Add as many cocktail franks (NOT canned) as desired and simmer until franks are done.

Remove with slotted spoon to serving dish; supply toothpicks for self-serve.

Can be kept hot in crock pot until serving time.
